This preliminary report includes a chart displaying the progress in the medical examinations of special “comfort women.” The chart items include regions (Nanjing, Wuhu, Jintan, and Zhenjiang [China]), number of examinations, average number of check-ups per day, cumulative number of check-ups, and number of disqualified cases. By the time when the report was made, the total number of check-ups was 2,113. A breakdown of the number by ethnicity is as follows: 1,095 Japanese, 198 Koreans, 820 Chinese, and 84 disqualified cases.
