This document is a request for an approval to send 20 extra “comfort women” because 50 military-exclusive “comfort women” who were dispatched to Borneo Island previously were not enough to meet the local needs and some of the women were not able to work after arrival. In addition, the document contains a further request that the future needs for small-scale recruitments, rotations, or increases in the number of women be addressed adequately.
