

Asian Solidarity Conference for Resolution of the Issue of Military Sexual Slavery by Japan

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As the Japanese military sexual slavery issue affected people across the Asia-Pacific region, survivors and activists have actively built transnational solidarity for the resolution of the Japanese military sexual slavery issue. Since 1992, the Korean Council has held Asian Solidarity Conference for Resolution of the Issue of Military Sexual Slavery by Japan to establish solidarity among victims, activists, and organizations from Asia-Pacific region. In addition to hearing survivors' testimonies, the Asian Solidarity Conference offered a space for survivors and activists to share their activism and adopt resolutions, action plans, and recommendations to call for the Japanese Government's official apology and legal reparations. From the 1st Asian Solidarity Conference for Resolution of the Issue of Military Sexual Slavery by Japan in 1992 to the 15th Asian Solidarity Conference was in 2018, the Asian Solidarity Conference took place in Seoul, South Korea, Saitama and Tokyo, Japan, Manila, the Philippines, and Taipei, Taiwan, and survivors and activists from North and South Korea, East Timor, Indonesia, China, the Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand, Hong Kong, Japan, the Netherlands, Germany, the United States, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand have gathered their voices.
