OVERVIEW | The judge dismissed the lawsuit for the plaintiff's lack of standing and found their claims that the City of Glendale violated the Supremacy Clause as baseless: "Glendale's placement of the Comfort Women monument in its Central Park does not pose the type of interference with the federal government's foreign affairs powers that states a plausible claim for relief. Instead, even according to the facts alleged in the Complaint, Glendale's placement of the statue is entirely consistent with the federal government's foreign policy."
