Punggyeong World Culture Association (hereinafter 'Punggyeong') is a non-profit institute based in Frankfurt, active in promoting art and culture, international solidarity, gender equality, and education. Established in December 2017, its main activity has been to publicize the "Peace Monument" which is one of the many statues memorializing the Japanese Military Sex Slavery, by staging exhibitions of the statue and publicizing the issue through website and collaboration with other local organizations.

Punggyeong views the history of Asian WWII is not a localized Asian issue but one that is universal; therefore, the Japanese Military Sexual Slavery victims issue needs to be remembered as part of a World history and makes efforts to share the issue globally. As part of this effort, a calendar that records every statute of the Japanese Military Sexual Slavery victims erected is exhibited along with the exhibition of photos of the statutes, the picture diary of the Filipino victim, Remedios Felias, the Map of "Comfort Stations" produced by WAM and the Peace Monument of a girl created by the wife and husband artist duo Kim Seo-Kyung and Un-Sung.
